THE PUBLIC HAS DECIDED! INCLUSIVE SKATING WINS £50,000 OF NATIONAL LOTTERY FUNDING AFTER CRUCIAL VOTE

A local community group based in Bearsden has won a public vote to secure £50,000 of National Lottery funding as part of this year's The People's Projects. The money was awarded after the Skate for All project won the public over with their plans for a UK wide development plan to help ice skaters with challenges access the sport.

The Bearsden-based project was one of five groups in STV West to compete for a share of a life changing £3 million. Each of the groups had their projects featured on prime time TV, giving the public a chance to see their fantastic work and then make the tough choice of where the money should go.

After being chosen by voters from across the region, Inclusive Skating will use this new funding to continue their work to bring people together, strengthen local communities across the UK and make a difference to people's lives.

The People's Projects is a partnership between The National Lottery Community Fund, The National Lottery and ITV / STV. Since 2005 it has given the public a unique say in how National Lottery money should be put to good use in their local area.

The People's Projects celebrates some of the incredible projects supported by The National Lottery Community Fund - the UK's largest funder of community activities. This year, 95 community groups across the UK were shortlisted, with five groups going head to head in each region.

Margarita Sweeney-Baird, Founder and Chair of Inclusive Skating said: "We are absolutely thrilled to have taken part in The People's Projects this year. It is has been a huge platform for us to raise awareness of the work we do, and we can't thank the public enough for getting behind us and giving us the opportunity to make our community a better place for all. This funding will enable us to train volunteers and coaches to set up Inclusive Skating clubs and activities throughout the UK. Free online training for volunteers and coaches will now be available. We will also have the funding for Coach development officers to help too!

Inclusive Skating was registered as a charity in September 2011. It was founded by Margarita Sweeney-Baird as part of her work to create a new competition and event system for skaters with challenges. www.inclusiveskating.org

The charity was registered as Impaired Skating with several alternative names to allow the skaters themselves to choose the name for their organisation. Following feed-back the name Inclusive Skating was chosen in 2013. Inclusive Skating relies almost entirely upon donations and volunteer support. It does not receive any public funding and donations go directly towards helping disabled ice skaters and their families and carers.
